ROGERS, ARKANSAS

Sample Group Tour Itinerary

Day One

Arrive in Rogers and check into one of more than half a dozen hotels less than 5 years old and conveniently located right off Interstate 540. Plan for a visit to **War Eagle Mill** with lunch at the Bean Palace Restaurant along with a stop at **War Eagle Cavern** (March – October) for cavern tours and gem panning. Have the Convention & Visitors Bureau arrange a nostalgic evening at **Simple Pleasures**, a private 1930s style facility for up to 500 featuring retro décor and games, eleven restored classic cars, hot-off-the-grill old-fashioned hickory-fired cheeseburgers or smoked BBQ.

Day Two

Schedule one of several available tours: Quilts in the Ozarks, Civil War in the Ozarks, Haunted History of the Ozarks or Backyard Billionaires: Ozark Entrepreneurs.

Spend the afternoon in **Historic Downtown Rogers**, where parking is available near Frisco Park and everything (including plenty of downtown shopping) is within walking distance. Lunch possibilities include sandwiches at Iron Horse Coffee Company or Switchback Cafe, piping hot orange rolls and chicken salad at the unique Crumpet Tea Room or traditional Mexican at Las Palmas. Intersperse shopping with nostalgia in the afternoon by visiting the **Rogers Historical Museum** to tour the historic **1895 Hawkins House** or see a traveling Smithsonian exhibit. Walking architecture and stained glass tours are also available by special arrangement.

Freshen up at the hotel for evening entertainment or head back downtown for a **Rogers Little Theater** dinner performance or peruse the art gallery and enjoy a private catered meal at the restored **1927 Victory Theater**. After dinner, the group can wander into the **Daisy Airgun Museum** for tours or out onto brick-lined streets near the Coca-Cola mural in Historic Downtown Rogers to try their hand at the mobile Daisy shooting gallery.

Day Three

- Option 1: Visit **Pea Ridge National Military Park**, the site of the March 1862 Civil War battle that saved Missouri for the Union. The park is one of the most well-preserved battlefields in the U.S. and offers a seven mile self-guided tour. On the way, stop at **House of Webster** for fruit preserves packed in Mason jars and unique Southern delicacies such as scuppernong jelly, chow chow, green tomato relish, smoked bacon and watermelon pickles.
- Option 2: **Shop Rogers:** Village on the Creeks, Scottsdale Center, Frisco Station Mall. Pinnacle Promenade, Pleasant Crossing and the Shoppes at Market Place, offer dining, movies and luxury retail venues.
